She is a Trustee of the Grand Rapids Foundation and a board member for the Women Lawyers' Association, the YWCA, and the West Michigan Branch of the of the American Civil Liberties Union.

In describing her commitment to human and civil rights, her nominator emphasizes, "She doesn't just voice this commitment, she lives it in her personal and professional life."
